Vincent HoSang Among National Awardees



Caribbean Food Delights Chairman, Vincent Getchun HoSang is among two hundred twenty-three (223) distinguished Jamaicans to receive national honors and awards in Jamaica on Heroes Day, October 19, 2015. HoSang is one of eight (8) who will be conferred with the Order of Jamaica (OJ), the country's fourth highest national honor. He is being honored for his philanthropic and dedicated service to Jamaica and the Jamaican Diaspora in New York.

The seven (7) other recipients are Dr. Glenford Christian, OD, for invaluable contribution to the Pharmaceutical Industry; Ambassador Derick Roy Heaven, CD, for distinguished service in the Public Sector and sterling leadership provided to the Sugar Industry; Professor Elsa Ann Leo-Rhynie, CD, for outstanding contribution to Academia; Reverend Dr Burchell Knibb Taylor, CD, for distinguished service in the field of Religion locally and internationally; Mr. Denis O'Brien (Honorary), for his sterling contribution to the

Telecommunications Industry in Jamaica; Reverend Father Louis Letellier Grenier, SJ, OD, for distinguished service to Religion, Education and Voluntary Service for more than 60 years; and Professor Graham Roger Serjeant, CD, for sterling contribution to Sickle Cell research, locally and internationally.

The remaining 115 recipients' awards include the Order of Distinction (in the rank of Commander (CD) and Officer (OD); the Medal of Honor for Meritorious Service; and the Badge of Honor for Meritorious and Long and Faithful Service.

Caribbean Food Delights CEO, Vincent HoSang recently donated another \$60,000.00 to the University of the West Indies (UWI) for the advancement of the Vincent HoSang UWI Entrepreneurship Program.

The program named in his honor, launched the Annual Vincent HoSang Business Venture Competition at the Mona School of

Business & Management in Jamaica on Wednesday, September 16, 2015. The competition which is aimed to provide funding for young entrepreneurs to transform business models into successful businesses, is in its eleventh year and takes place on November 19 and 20.

In making his presentation, Dr. HoSang implored the young entrepreneurs to embrace the field of technology and to incorporate it in their areas of study. He said, "Technology is advancing and it is rapidly changing the way we communicate and the way companies conduct business globally."

Prizes for the competition are sponsored by corporate Jamaica and are awarded in Jamaican dollars with the winner receiving \$500,000, second place \$330,000 and third, \$220,000.

The Vincent HoSang Business Venture Competition is sponsored in part by the Mona School of Business, Jamaica Observer, Jamaica Yellow Pages, Jamaica National Small Business Loans, UHY Dawgen Chartered Accounts and the Development Bank of Jamaica.

LOSE TO WIN

In its continued efforts to foster health and wellness, Caribbean Food Delights (CFD) in association with the Nyack Hospital hosted another in a series of their Lose to Win Weight Loss Program at the company's headquarters in Tappan, NY in September.

The eight week program which was designed to improve employee wellness not just at the

workplace, but also to promote positive behavioral changes, was well received. Facilitated by CFD directors in recent months, the class was hosted by first time instructor, Simone HoSang, Director of Nutrition & Food Science.

HoSang said, "It was very encouraging to see how enthusiastic the employees were about the program." An advocate for healthy living, she has plans to incorporate various health and wellness tips not just during class sessions, but all year round.

Each week during the program, Simone made a healthy lunch for her class from some of her favorite recipes to demonstrate www.ChooseMyPlate.gov recommended guidelines on how to portion your plate. The idea was well received and each participant got to take home copies of the recipes to share with

their families.

According to Denise Roma, Community Health Educator at Nyack Hospital who coordinates and collects data for each class, Simone's group lost a total of 20 pounds with the average weight loss per person being five pounds. The positive feedback from the participants included: creative healthy lunches provided, learned about healthy eating versus crash dieting, how to eat the right kind of food and proper exercise, very educational, helped me become more aware of how to control my eating.

There will be another class held in the beginning of the new year to assist with employees' new weight loss resolutions. Dates of sessions will be announced in January 2016.

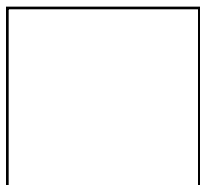
